

side of said creek; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use of said Llewelyn Rees, under and by virtue of priority No. 14, one cubic foot of water per second of time for four days in each thirty-two days, and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Benjamin Eggington, under and by virtue of priority No. 38, said quantity of water per second of time for the further time of five (5) days in each thirty-two (32) days; that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Rees, under and by virtue of priority No. 50, said quantity of one cubic foot of water per second of time for the further time of ten (10) days in each thirty-two (32) days; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Eggington, under and by virtue of priority No. 338, said quantity of one cubic foot of water per second of time for the still further time of one day (1 day) in each thirty-two days (32).

No. 50—The Marcott Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 52, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 21; that said ditch is owned by Henry A. Watson; that said ditch takes its water from Four Mile Creek, and its headgate is situate on the East side of said creek in the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section 12, Tp. 15 S., R. 71 West, at a point about one hundred and seventy-five feet from the South West corner of said forty acre tract; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of forty acres of land; and that for the use and benefit of said Watson, under and by virtue of said priority No. 52, there be allowed to flow into said ditch, one and six tenths (1.6) cubic feet of water per second of time, continuously during
