

of time for three (3) days out of each sixteen (16) days, the times to be selected, as far as possible when prior ditches allowed water for only a part of the time, are not using water.

No. 66—The Thomas Patton Ditch No. 1.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 66, 88 and 242, which are also Beaver Creek priorities Nos. 14, 21 and 38; that said ditch is owned by Thomas Patton; that said ditch draws its supply of water from said Beaver Creek, and is used for the irrigation of thirty acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Patton, under and by virtue of priority No. 66, one cubic foot of water per second of time for such time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of five (5) acres of land; that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch for the uses aforesaid and for the benefit of said Patton, under and by virtue of priority No. 88 said cubic foot of water per second of time for such additional time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of eighteen (18) additional acres of land; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Patton under and by virtue of priority No. 242, constantly during the irrigation season, the further amount of twenty-eight hundredths (0.28) of one cubic foot of water per second of time.

No. 67—The Lobach Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 66, which is Hardscrabble Creek priority No. 15; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of six (6) acres; that said ditch takes its water from Hardscrabble Creek and that its headgate is located on the West
