

side of said creek; that William C. Parker is the owner of said ditch; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Parker, under and by virtue of priority No. 66, one half of one cubic foot of water per second of time for three (3) days out of each twenty (20) days, the times to be selected, as far as possible, at times when prior ditches allowed water for only part of the time, are not using water.

#### No. 68—The Ritter Ditch No. 1.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 68, 233 and 360, which are also Texas Creek priorities Nos. 3, 62 and 99; that said ditch is owned by Frederick Vahldick and A. J. Browning; that said ditch takes water from Texas Creek and its head-gate is situate on the North West bank of said creek at a point whence the S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner, Sec. 29, Tp. 21 S., R. 73 West bears S. 48 degrees and 7 minutes W., 592 feet; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of one hundred and five (105) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use and benefit of said A. J. Browning, under said priority No. 68, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for such time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of twenty (20) acres of land, that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said A. J. Browning, under and by virtue of priority No. 233, continually, the further quantity of one and five hundred and eighty-seven thousandths (1.587) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of Frederick Valdick, under and by virtue of priority No. 360, the further quantity of one cubic foot of water per second of time for such
