

### No. 76—The Bellnap Ditch No. 1.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No. 73 and 122, which is also Texas Creek priorities Nos. 4 and 20 and Lake Creek priorities Nos. 1 and 2; that said ditch is owned by Henry Belknap; that said ditch takes its water from Lake Creek and that its headgate is located on the West side of said Lake Creek at a point to find which commence on the South boundary line of the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 26, Tp. 47 N., R. 12 East where said boundary line intersects the East side of the County road, and from thence run North 46 degrees East 2 chains and ten links; thence North 79 degrees, East 9 chains and 40 links to said headgate; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of sixty-five (65) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Belknap, under and by virtue of priority No. 73, one and five hundredths cubic feet of water per second of time for such time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of twenty-five acres of land; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch for the use of said Belknap, under and by virtue of priority No. 122, continually, the further amount of one and five hundredths (1.05) cubic feet of water per second of time.

### No. 77—The Percival Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 77, 129 and 367, which are also Hardscrabble Creek priorities Nos. 26, 16 and 60; that M. S. Jennings and Harvey Linsley are the owners, each owning one half, of said ditch as it existed prior to an enlargement and extension made in February 1889, and that Emmet E. Jennings and Mary C. Jennings are
