

Creek priorities Nos. 3 and 17; that Columbus Mann is the owner of said ditch; that the headgate of said ditch is situate on the North side of said creek at a point in the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 2, Tp. 17 S. R. 73 West; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of eleven acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Mann, under and by virtue of priority No. 84, so much water as said ditch will carry for as many periods not exceeding three, of six days each, as may be sufficient to irrigate six acres of land; and that said amount of water will be further allowed to flow in said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 242 for as many additional periods, not exceeding three, of five days each, as may be sufficient to irrigate five acres of land; that said ditch is 12 inches wide, one foot deep, and its fall one-fourth of an inch to the rod.

94—The Potato Patch Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No. 86 and 378, which are also Middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek priorities Nos. 1 and 11; that Daniel Hall is the owner of said ditch; that the headgate of said ditch is situate on the South side of the Middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek below the junction of the North and South prongs of said Middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 86, one cubic foot of water per second of time for as many periods, in each year, of one and one half days each, as shall be necessary to irrigate three (3) acres of land, and that said cubic foot of water be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 378, for such additional periods, in each year, of one and one half days each, as shall be necessary to
