

Creek six rods North of the line dividing the North half and the South half of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 21 and 3 rods East of the West line of said Sec. 21, all in Tp. 16 S. R. 73 West; said ditch is 2 feet 7 inches wide at top, 16 inches at bottom 8 inches deep, and has a grade of three fourths of an inch to the rod; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 40 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch under and by virtue of priority No. 89, so much water as said ditch will carry for as many periods not exceeding three, of one day each, as will be sufficient to irrigate three acres of land; that said quantity of water be further allowed to flow in said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 194, for as many additional periods, not exceeding three, of six days each, as shall be sufficient to irrigate 18 acres of land; and that said quantity of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 272, for as many additional periods, not exceeding three, of six and one half days each, as shall be sufficient to irrigate 19 acres of land.

No. 100—The Drury Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 89, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 31; that said ditch takes its water from Hay Creek, which is a tributary of Four Mile Creek, and empties into said Four Mile above the mouth of any other tributary of said creek concerning which evidence has been given before the referee of Water District No. 12; that priority No. 86 is the first priority on said Hay Creek and is also the first priority on Four Mile Creek above the mouth of West Four Mile Creek; that Charles Drury is the owner of said ditch; that
