

the headgate of said ditch is located at a point in the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 19, Tp. 14 S. R. 70 West, in the County of El Paso, and is 16 chains N. and 2 chains and 18 yards West of the S. E. corner of said tract above described; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 30 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Drury, under and by virtue of said priority No. 89, one and two tenths (1.2) cubic feet of water per second of time for and during the irrigating season.

#### No. 101—The Watson Ditch No. 1.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 90, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 32; that said ditch takes its water from main Four Mile Creek above the mouth of West Four Mile Creek and above the mouth of Bernard Creek, but below the mouth of Hay Creek, and is entitled to the fifth priority on the upper portion of said Four Mile Creek, the 2nd priority above the mouth of West Four Mile Creek, and the first priority on the main channel of Four Mile Creek above the mouth of said West Four Mile Creek; that Henry Watson is the owner of said ditch; that its headgate is located on the East side of said Four Mile Creek in the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 1, Tp. 15 S., R. 71 W., in the County of El Paso, at a point 150 feet from the S. W. corner of said tract; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 40 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Watson, under and by virtue of said priority No. 90, during the irrigation season, one and six tenths (1.6) cubic feet of water per second of time.
