

12 and Brush Creek priority No. 2; that Asa S. Gove is the owner of said ditch; that said ditch takes its water from said Brush Creek, and its headgate is located on the East side of said creek at a point to find which commence at the Section corner common to sections 1, 2, 11 and 12, Tp. 46 N. R. 12 E, thence S. 78 degrees and 45 minutes E 8 chains and 80 links, thence S. 86 degrees E, 1 chain and 80 links, thence S. 59 degrees and 45 minutes E, 1 chain and 40 links, thence S 7 degrees W, 60 links, to headgate; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 25 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Gove, under and by virtue of said priority No. 94, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for such time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of said twenty-five acres of land.

No. 109—The Sharp-Foster Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 94, which is also Texas Creek priority No. 12 and Brush Creek priority No. 2, North Brush Creek priority No. 2; that said ditch is owned by George S. Foster; that said ditch takes its water from said North Brush Creek, and its headgate is situate in the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 22, Tp. 46, N. R. 12 E, on the North bank of said creek; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 60 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Foster, under and by virtue of said priority No. 94, one and fifty-seven hundred and eighty-nine ten thousandths (1.5789) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that said amount of water be allowed to run in said ditch constantly.
