

by virtue of said priority No. 114, one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one cubic foot of water per second of time or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the irrigation of said 40 acres of land.

No. 128—The Hayden Ditch No. 2.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 114 and 261, which are also Hayden Creek priorities No's 5 and 12; that said ditch is owned by Chauncey Hayden and Margaret Hayden, each of whom owns an undivided one half thereof; that said ditch takes its water from said Hayden Creek; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of seventy-five (75) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, continuously for the **use and benefit** of said owners, under and by virtue of said priority No. 114, two and six tenths (2.6) cubic feet of water per second of time or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the irrigation of 65 acres of land; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, continuously for the use of said owners, under and by virtue of priority No. 261, the further quantity of four tenths (0.4) of one cubic foot of water per second of time or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the irrigation of 10 acres of land.

No. 129—The Caeradock Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 115, which is also Howard (or Flint) Creek priority No. 3; that said ditch is owned by John Peregrine; that said ditch takes its water from the North side of the said Howard Creek in the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Tp. 48 N., R. 10 E.; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of seventy
