

owner, under and by virtue of said priority No. 133, one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient to irrigate said 10 acres of land.

No. 153—The John Baker Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 133, 337, and 370, which are also Cottonwood Creek (the Cottonwood Creek that empties directly into said Arkansas River) priorities No's 1, 4, and 5; that John Baker owns an undivided two thirds of said ditch and Mary Smith an undivided one third thereof; and that said ditch takes its water from the West side of said creek at a point S. 5 degrees E, 112 poles, from the S. E. corner of the S. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Tp. 47 N, R 11 E; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of sixty-seven acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Baker, under and by virtue of priority No. 133, one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient for the irrigation of twenty (20) acres of land; that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the irrigation of 18 acres owned by said Baker and of fifteen (15) acres owned by said Mary Smith, under and by virtue of priority No. 337, constantly during the irrigation season, the further quantity of one and thirty-two hundredths (1.32) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch constantly during the irrigation season for the use and benefit of said Baker, under and by virtue of priority No. 370 the additional quantity of fifty-six hundredths (0.56) cubic feet of water per second of time.
