

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 135 and 369, which are also Hayden Creek priorities No's 7 and 18; that Alfred Lanoue is the owner of an undivided one half interest in said ditch; that said ditch takes its water from the West side of said Hayden Creek, 60 rods from the S. W. corner of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5, Tp. 47 N, R 11 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of Forty (40) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Lanoue, under and by virtue of priority No. 135, constantly during the irrigation season, one and two tenths (1.2) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Lanoue, under and by virtue of said priority No. 369, continuously during the irrigation season, four tenths (0.4) of one cubic foot of water per second of time.

No. 155—The Riggs Ditch No. 2.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No| 136, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 39; that said ditch is owned by Julia S. Riggs; that the headgate of said ditch is on the South side of main Four Mile Creek, in the County of El Paso; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of thirty-five acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, for the use of the owner of said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 136, one and four tenths (1.4) cubic feet of water per second of time.
