

Kate Gorman, under and by virtue of said priority No. 138, one and one half cubic feet of water per second of time for as many periods, not exceeding five, of five days each, as shall be necessary for the irrigation of said ten acres of land. Provided, however, that as between The Gorman Ditch No. 2 and The Gardner Ditches No's 1, 2, 3 and 4 the said The Gorman Ditch No. 2 shall have the exclusive right and privilege to use and divert all of the waters flowing in said main Tallahassee Creek, for the purpose of irrigation, two days in each and every week commencing at 6 P. M on Sunday of each and every week to and until 6 P. M on Tuesday of each and every week; but this proviso shall effect no other rights or priority except those herein specified.

No. 159—The Vahldick Ditch No. 2.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 74, 138 and 274, which are also Texas Creek priorities No's 5 26 and 80, and Greenleaf Creek priorities No's 1-A, 3 and 7; that said ditch is owned by Frederick Vohldick; that said ditch takes its water from the South East side of said Greenleaf Creek, at a point whence the N. $\frac{3}{4}$ corner of Section 29, Tp 21 S, R 73 West, bears N. 40 degrees East, 748 feet; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of eighty-five acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly, for the use of said owner in the irrigation of fifteen acres of land, under and by virtue of priority No. 74, three hundred and ninety-four thousandths (0.394) of one cubic foot of water per second of time; that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 138, constantly, the further quantity of one and seventy-one hundredths (1.71)
