

in the County of El Paso; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 60 acres of land owned by Henry A. Watson and 40 acres owned by Charles Kittridge; that said Henry A. Watson owns two-thirds of said ditch and Charles Kittridge one third; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said owners thereof, under and by virtue of said priority No. 139, constantly during the irrigation season, four (4) cubic feet of water per second of time; that no additional land has been cultivated by reason of said priority No. 156.

No. 167—The 1874 Ditch

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 141, which is also Stout Creek priority No. 3; that said ditch is owned by Malissie E. Stout; that said ditch takes its water from the South side of said Stout Creek in the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 12, Tp. 48 N, R 10 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of seventy (70) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Malissie E. Stout, under and by virtue of said priority No. 141, constantly during the irrigation season, two and eight tenths (2.8) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 168—The Second Leon Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 142, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 42; that said priority is also the 8th priority on the upper part of said Four Mile Creek, and the 17th priority on upper Four Mile and West Four Mile, taken together; that said ditch is owned by John Witcher; that the head of said ditch is located
