

at the junction of Four Mile Creek and Bernard Creek, on the West side of said Four Mile; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of thirty-five acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Witcher, under and by virtue of said priority No. 142, constantly during the irrigation season, one and four tenths (1.4) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 169—The First Leon Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 143 and 338, which are also Four Mile Creek priorities No's 43 and 74; that said ditch is owned by John Witcher; that said ditch takes its water from said Four Mile Creek; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Witcher, under and by virtue of priority No. 143, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient to irrigate sixteen (16) acres of land; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Witcher, under and by virtue of priority No. 338, constantly during the irrigation season, the further amount of one cubic foot of water per second of time.

No. 170—The First Bernard Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 144, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 44; that said ditch is owned by John R. Witcher; that said ditch takes its water from Bernard Creek, and its head is on the East side of said creek in the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 18, Tp. 15 S, R 70 West, in the County of El Paso; that the
