

location of the headgate of said ditch is such that this ditch is only subject to the older priorities of the ditches heading in the County of Fremont, that is to say, that this ditch is only subject to priorities No's 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 27, 28, 29, and 36; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of sixteen (16) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Witcher, under and by virtue of said priority No. 144, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient to irrigate said 16 acres of land.

#### No. 171—The Westheffer Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 145, which is also Hardscrabble Creek priority No. 30; that said ditch is owned by David Westheffer; that said ditch takes its water from Lewis Creek, which is a tributary of Hardscrabble Creek, and its headgate is on the North side of said creek in the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 29, Tp. 21 S, R 69 West, in the County of Custer; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of twenty-four acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said owner, under and by virtue of said priority No. 145, one half of one cubic foot of water per second of time for six (6) days in every ten (10) days, the times to be chosen, as far as possible, so as to alternate with ditches having priority over this ditch and not having a continuous flow of water decreed to them, or said water shall be allowed to flow in said ditch for such less time as may be sufficient for the irrigation of said 24 acres of land.
