E. corner of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Tp. 48 N, R 10 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of one hundred (100) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, for the use and benefit of the owners thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 148, one cubic foot of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, under and by virtue of priority No. 225, the further quantity of three (3) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 175—The Hunt Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 149 and 233, which are also Four Mile Creek priorities No's 45 and 63; that said ditch belongs to the estate of G. M. Hunt, deceased; that said ditch takes its water from said Four Mile Creek at a point on the East side of said creek 30 rods North from the North West corner of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 21, Tp. 17 S, R 70 West; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of nineteen (19) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of the persons lawfully entitled thereto, under and by virtue of priority No. 149, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient to irrigate fifteen (15) acres of land; and that said quantity of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of the persons entitled thereto, under and by virtue of priority No.
