

233, for such additional time and times as shall be sufficient to irrigate four (4) additional acres of land.

(Note: Point of diversion changed to headgate of the Aaron Ripley Ditch No. 37 by decree dated Aug. 4, 1902, recorded in Book 12, Page 522.)

#### No. 176—The West Side Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 150, 197 and 264, which are also Stout Creek priorities No's 5, 8 and 13; that said ditch is owned by John A. Davis; that said ditch takes its water from said Stout Creek, and its headgate is located on the West side of said creek in the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 14, Tp. 48 N, R. 10 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of one hundred (100) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Davis, under and by virtue of priority No. 150, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient to irrigate thirty (30) acres of land; that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Davis, under and by virtue of priority No. 197, constantly during the irrigation season, the further quantity of four tenths (0.4) of one cubic foot of water per second of time; and that there be still further allowed to run in said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, for the use and benefit of said Davis, under and by virtue of said priority No. 264, the further quantity of two and four tenths (2.4) cubic feet of water per second of time.

#### No. 177—The Kestle Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 152, which is also Four Mile Creek pri-
