

and its headgate is situated is S. 31 degrees and 30 minutes W. from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner between Sections 13 and 14, Tp. 46 N, R 12 East, distant 1760 feet; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of ninety (90) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Adams, under and by virtue of priority No. 152, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as shall be sufficient for the irrigation of five (5) acres of land; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Adams, under and by virtue of priority No. 243, constantly, the further quantity of two and twenty-three hundred and sixty-eight ten thousandths (2.2368) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 179—The Burgman Ditch No. 2.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 152, which is also Texas Creek priority No. 30; that said ditch is owned by John P. Burgman; that said ditch draws its water from the East side of said Texas Creek; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of thirty (30) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Burgman, under and by virtue of priority No. 152, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient to irrigate said 30 acres of land.
