

(3.5) days each, as is necessary for the irrigation of said seven acres of land.

No. 186—The Cox Ditch No. 1.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 156, which is also main Tallahassee Creek priority No. 6; that said ditch is owned by F. A. Reynolds; that said ditch takes water from Tallahassee Creek, and its headgate is located on the East side of said creek at a point from the quarter corner on the East line of Sec. 25, Tp. 17 S, R 73 West, N. 85 degrees and 48 minutes West, 2492 feet; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of fifteen (15) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Reynolds, under and by virtue of said priority No. 156, one and one half cubic feet of water per second of time for as many periods in each year, of seven and one half days each, as shall be sufficient to irrigate said fifteen acres of land.

No. 187—The Puett Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 156, which is also Texas Creek priority No. 32, and Spruce Creek priority No. 5; that said ditch is owned by Taliaferro Witcher; that said ditch takes its water from Spruce Creek, and its headgate bears South 62 degrees and 30 minutes East, 1125 feet, from the South West corner of Sec. 3, Tp. 46 N, R 12 East; that the testimony fails, absolutely, to show how many acres are irrigated from this ditch or what rights Mr. Witcher has thereunder.
