

benefit of said Hall, under and by virtue of priority No. 170, one and one half cubic feet of water per second of time, for as many periods, in each year, of ten days each as shall be necessary for the irrigation of said twenty acres of land. Provided, however, that as between the Morning Star Ditch and the ditches of George Fear: The Jack Ditch, The North Spring Ditch, The Spring Ditch, The Meadow Ditch and The Garden Ditch, the said ditches of the said Fear shall have the prior right to the use of all the water flowing in, and to flow in, the middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek, above and at the junction of the North and South branches thereof, at the natural and unobstructed flow therein, for two days, of 24 hours each, out of each and every five days, and that said Daniel Hall shall have the prior right to all of said water during the three days, of 24 hours each, out of said five days, next after said Fear's said two days, and that when the said water shall fail through natural causes as to flow in said creek in quantities not sufficient to be of use to said Daniel Hall, then and during the times of said insufficient flow, said George Fear shall have the exclusive use of each and every spring which rises upon his (said Fear's) ranch.

No. 205—The Mermod Ditch No. 4.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 171, which is also Cottonwood Creek priority No. 8; that said ditch is owned by The Poncha Park Land and Cattle Company; that its headgate is located on the West side of Little Cottonwood Creek at a point thereon South 52 minutes West, distant, 3550 feet, from the quarter section corner on the North line of section 21, Tp. 51 N., R. 12 East;
