

North side thereof to find which begin at the quarter section corner between sections 2 and 3 in T. 46 N, R 12 East N. M principal meridian, run thence S. 77 degrees and 5 minutes West, 8 chains and 70 links, thence N. 58 degrees and 30 minutes West, 96 links to headgate; that said ditch is used by said Balman for the irrigation of seventy-five acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly, for the use and benefit of said Thomas Balman, under and by virtue of said priority No. 171, one and ninety seven hundred and thirty-six ten thousandths (1.9736) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 209—The Houle Ditch No. 3.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 171 and 340, which are also Texas Creek priorities No's 36 and 93, and Brush Creek priorities No's 12 and 38; that said ditch is owned by Elizabeth Houle; that said ditch takes its water from main Brush Creek at a point N. 50 degrees East, and distant 790 feet, from the S. W corner of the N W quarter of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 13, Tp. 46 N, R 12 E; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of twenty-five acres of land, and to assist in the irrigation of ten more acres of land which are irrigated from the Houle Ditch No. 1 when sufficient water can be had in said ditch; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Houle, under and by virtue of said priority No. 171, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during
