

such time and times as is sufficient to irrigate fifteen acres of land; and that said quantity of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 340 for such additional time and times as is sufficient to irrigate ten additional acres of land; and that at such times as South Fork of Brush Creek does not furnish the Houle Ditch No. 1 with the quantity of water herein decreed to it ten of the seventy acres irrigated from said ditch may be irrigated from this ditch, under priority No. 340, and for that purpose one cubic foot of water may be allowed to flow in this ditch.

No. 210—The North Spring Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 172 and 391, which are also Middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek priorities No's 7 and 12; that said ditch is owned by George Fear; that the headgate of said ditch is located at the same dam as Fear's Spring Ditch, on the opposite side of the stream; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of six and one half acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Fear, under and by virtue of priority No. 172, as much water as a ditch 2 feet wide, 7 inches deep and having a grade of one inch to the rod, will carry for as many periods in each year, of three days each, as shall be sufficient to irrigate six (6) acres of land; and that said amount of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 391 for such additional number of periods, in each year of one day each, as shall be sufficient to irrigate one additional half acre of land.
