

ditches of Daniel Hall: The Pioneer Ditch, The Potato Patch Ditch, The Morning Star Ditch and The Dick Creek Ditch, the said The North Spring Ditch shall have the prior right to all the water flowing in, and to flow in, the middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek above and at the junction of the North and South branches thereof, at the natural and unobstructed flow and stages therein, of two days of 24 hours each, out of each and every five days, and that when the said water shall so fail through natural causes as to flow in said creek in quantities not sufficient to be of use to said Daniel Hall, then and during the said times of insufficient flow, said Fear shall have the exclusive use to all and every natural spring which rises upon his (said Fear's) ranch.

No. 211—The Arch North Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 172, which is also middle Fork of Tallahassee Creek priority No. 7; that said ditch is owned by George A. Hall; that its head is situate on the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 12, Tp. 17 S, R 73 West, 60 rods South from N. W. corner of said forty acre tract; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of nine (9) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Hall, under and by virtue of priority No. 172, so much water as a ditch 20 inches wide, 8 inches deep, and having a grade of two inches to the rod will carry for as many periods each year, of four and one half days each, as shall be sufficient to irrigate said nine acres of land.

Provided, however, that as between the said George Hall and Daniel Hall the said George Hall shall have all the water, in the irrigating season,
