

Squaw Creek, a tributary of Cottonwood Creek, North 84 degrees and 40 minutes East, 1200 feet distant, from the S. W. corner of Sec. 3, Tp. 16, S, R 73 West; that the said ditch is used for the irrigation of 12 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Black, under and by virtue of said priority No. 173, one cubic foot of water per second of time for as many periods not exceeding three, of three days each, as may be necessary to irrigate three acres of land; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch for the use aforesaid, under and by virtue of priority No. 278, said cubic foot of water per second of time for as many additional periods, not exceeding three, of four and one half days each, as may be necessary to irrigate nine (9) acres of land.

No. 215—The Houle Ditch No. 2.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 173 and 392, which are also Texas Creek priorities No's 37 and 111, Brush Creek priorities No's 13 and 49; that said ditch is owned by Elizabeth Houle; that said ditch takes its water from Brush Creek below the junction of the two branches which form said creek; that its headgate is at a point on the North West side of said creek 48 degrees East, distant 350 feet, from the S. W. corner of the N. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 13, Tp. 46 N, R 12 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of seventy (70) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch under and by virtue of priority No. 173, constantly, one and three tenths (1.3) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch,
