

No. 43, and Brush Creek priority No. 15, and North Brush Creek priority No. 7; that said ditch is owned by Elizabeth Houle; that said ditch takes its water from North Brush Creek, and its headgate is situate on the West side of said Creek at a point S. 35 degrees W, 500 feet from the S. W. corner of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 14, Tp. 46 N, R. 12 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of ten (10) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use and benefit of the owner thereof, under and by virtue of said priority No. 188, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient to irrigate said ten acres of land.

No. 233—The Mineral Creek Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 189 and 310, which are also Adobe and Mineral Creek priorities No's 7 and 12; that said ditch is owned by the heirs of Thomas R. Rule, deceased, who are Margaret Rule, his widow, and John W. Rule, Harriet Stayton, Belle Dodson, Silas Rule and Ida Burroughs, his children; that said ditch, in connection with The Banks Ditch, is used for the irrigation of fifty (50) acres of land; that said ditch takes its water from Mineral Creek in the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 6, Tp. 21 S, R. 69 West; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the irrigation of said 50 acres of land, under and by virtue of priority No. 189, and priority No. 188 of Banks Ditch, six hundred and twenty-five thousandths (0.625) of one cubic foot of water per second of time or so much thereof as is necessary for the irrigation of said 50 acres of land; and that if possible one half of said amount shall be allowed
