

to flow into each ditch, but that, if it be impossible to allow half thereof to run into either ditch without interference with prior rights, then a proportionally larger allowance shall be made to the other of said ditches; that water is also diverted from said Mineral Creek through this ditch by Joseph Blunt, who owns no part of the ditch, but who with his grantors——— has been allowed by the owners of this ditch to appropriate water thereby, for the irrigation of fifteen acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Blunt, under and by virtue of priority No. 310 the additional quantity of one half of one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during three days in each week, or so much thereof, and for such part of said time, as is necessary for the irrigation of said 15 acres of land; and that if at any time, said Joseph Blunt shall be prevented, by the owners of said ditch, from thus using it, he shall be allowed to divert from said Mineral Creek the amount of water above set forth, and under said priority No. 310, by such other means as he may lawfully choose. It is further decreed and ordered that the rights of this ditch under both priorities are not, in any manner, subject or subordinate to the priorities of The Banks Ditch and of The Dick Steele Ditch.

#### No. 234—The Jackson Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 190, which is also Cherry Creek priority No. 1; that said ditch is owned by George W. Jackson; that said ditch takes water from said Cherry Creek, and its headgate is situate at a point 1853 feet west of, and 550 feet N of the section corner common to sections 14, 15, 22 and 23 in Tp. 48 N,
