

orities No's 203 and 273, which are also Texas Creek priorities No's 47 and 79; that said ditch is owned by Henry Belknap and Carrie Hendrickson, each of whom owns an undivided one half thereof; that said ditch takes its water from the West side of said Texas Creek at a point to find which run from the S. W. corner of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 36, Tp. 47 N., R. 12 East N 74 degrees and 15 minutes West, three chains and 44 links, thence S. 13 degrees West one chain and 76 links to headgate; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of sixty (60) acres owned by said Belknap and sixty (60) acres owned by said Hendrickson; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, for the use of said Belknap, under and by virtue of priority No. 203, one and five hundred and seventy-eight thousandths (1.578) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch for the use and benefit of said Carrie Hendrickson, constantly during the irrigation season, under and by virtue of priority No. 273, the further quantity of one and five hundred and seventy-eight thousandths (1.578) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 247—The John Stulz Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities, No's 203, 273 and 391, which are also Oak Creek priorities No's 4, 13 and 25; that said ditch is owned by John Stulz; that said ditch takes water from Oak Creek, and its headgate is situate 1076 feet West and 270 feet N., from the S. E. corner of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 8, Tp. 20 S., R. 70 West; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of seven (7) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into
