

No. 249—The Tremayne Brothers Ditch No. 4.

No. 113—The Tremayne Brothers Ditch No. 2.

That said ditches take their supply of water from the North side of West Four Mile Creek; that the said Tremayne Brothers Ditch No. 2 is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 98, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 34, and which is the 8th priority on said West Four Mile Creek and the said The Tremayne Brothers Ditch No. 4 is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 204, which is also Four Mile Creek priority No. 57, but has never made any appropriation of water on its own account, having been used to procure for The Tremayne Brothers Ditch No. 2 the water needed for irrigating precisely the lands that were irrigated before the construction of said ditch No. 4; that Richard Tremayne and John Tremayne are the owners of said ditch, each owning one half thereof; that the head of said ditch No. 2 is at the point where said West Four Mile Creek crosses the line of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 4, Tp. 15 S, R 71 West, in the County of Park; that the head of said ditch No. 4 is about 25 yards East of the S. W corner of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 4, Tp. 15 S, R 71 West and flows into ditch No. 2 very near the center of said last mentioned tract; that said ditches are used for the irrigation of thirty-five (35) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditches, and into either of them, constantly during the irrigation season, under and by virtue of said priority No. 98, one and four tenths (1.4) cubic feet of water per second of time.
