

riority No. 233, which is also Texas Creek priority No. 61, Brush Creek priority No. 23, and North Brush Creek priority No. 9; that said ditch is owned by John Adams that said ditch takes its water from said North Brush Creek, and its headgate is situate at a point to find which commence at the quarter section corner between sections 13 and 14, Tp. 46 N, R 12 East, run thence N, 88 degrees West, 4 chains and sixty-four links, thence N. 89 degrees W, 3 chains and 45 links, thence N. 89 degrees and 45 minutes W, 12 chains and 70 links to headgate; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of fifteen (15) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said owner of said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 233, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said fifteen acres of land.

No. 274—The Bricks Creek Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 233 and 271, which are also Texas Creek priority No's 62 and 78, and Bricks Creek priorities No's 1 and 2; that said ditch is owned by Jacob Schueler and Frederick Vahldick; that the head of said ditch is located on the S. E. bank of Bricks Creek at a point whence the W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 30, Tp. 21 S, R 73 W, bears S 85 degrees and ten minutes W, 2100 feet; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of fifteen (15) acres of land owned by said Schueler and twenty (20) acres owned by said Vahldick; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Schueler under and by virtue of priority No. 233, one cubic
