

No. 40; that said ditch is owned by Joseph McGowen; that said ditch is used for the irrigation five and one quarter (5.25) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of the owner thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 246, one cubic foot of water, for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said five and one quarter acres.

No. 287—The Herrick Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 247, which is also Oak Creek priority No. 8; that said ditch is owned by Joel S. Culver and William C. Barnes; that the head of said ditch is situate on the East bank of Oak Creek in the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 12 Tp. 21 S, R 71 West; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of Four (4) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of the said owners thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 247, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said four acres of land.

No. 288—Grose's Extension of the Frazier Ditch.

No. 112—The Pauls Ditch, also Called The Frazier Ditch.

That all of the above names apply to different portions of the same ditch; that said ditch takes its supply from West Four Mile Creek, and its head-gate is situate on the North side of said creek in the County of Park; that Charles Kestle is the owner of the part which flows through his (said Kestle's) lands; that this portion of said ditch owned
