

ond of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient to irrigate three and one half acres of land; and that said quantity of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Crozier, under and by virtue of priority No. 358, for such additional time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of sixteen acres of land.

No. 297—The Heath Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 256 and 315, which are also Hardscrabble Creek priorities No's 41 and 49; that said ditch is owned by George W. Heath; that said ditch takes its water from said Hardscrabble Creek, and its head is on the East side thereof; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of three acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Heath, under and by virtue of said priority No. 256, one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of three fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of one acre of land; and that said amount of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 315, for such additional time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of two and three fourths ($2\frac{3}{4}$) acres of land.

No. 298—The Griffin Ditch No. 3.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No's 258 and 338, which are also Oak Creek priorities No's 11 and 19; that said ditch is owned by George W. Griffin; that said ditch takes water from said Oak Creek and its headgate is situate on the East side of said creek at a point 673 feet S.
