

orities No's 266, 321 and 335, which are also Beaver Creek priorities No's 42, 49 and 51; that said ditch is owned by Huston Hughes; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of four and one half (4.5) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said owner thereof, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said four and one half acres of land; and that said quantity of water be allowed to flow into said ditch, for such time and times as necessary for the irrigation of one fourth of said four and one half acres of land, under and by virtue of priority No. 266, for such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of one eighth of said four and one half acres of land, under and by virtue of priority No. 321, and for such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of the balance of said four and one half acres of land, under and by virtue of said priority No. 335.

No. 305—The Amsbary Ditch No. 1.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No's 198 and 268, which are also Texas Creek priorities No's 45 and 76, and Lake Creek No's 7 and 10; that Joseph M. Lamb and George B. Amsbary each own an undivided one half interest in and to the the first two hundred yards of said ditch, and that Joseph M. Lamb owns the balance of said ditch; that said ditch takes its water from Lake Creek and its headgate is situate on the South side of said creek at a point N. 8 degrees E, 650 feet, from the South West corner of Sec. 34, Tp. 47 N, R 12 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of eighty (80) acres owned by said Lamb and twen-
