

ty (20) acres owned by said Amsbury; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the irrigation of fifty (50) acres owned by said Lamb, under and by virtue of priority No. 198, constantly, one and thirty-one hundredths (1.31) cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to run in said ditch, for the irrigation of thirty (30) additional acres owned by Lamb and 20 acres irrigated by said Amsbury, constantly, under and by virtue of priority No. 268, the further quantity of one and thirty-one hundredths (1.31) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 306—The Fansher Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 268, which is also Beaver Creek priority No. 43; that said ditch is owned by John M. Fansher; that said ditch takes its water from said Beaver Creek; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Fansher, under and by virtue of priority No. 268, one cubic foot of water for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of twenty acres of land.

No. 307—The Oak Creek Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 269, 294, 361, 406, and 399, which are also Oak Grove Creek (tributary to Arkansas River) priorities no's 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5; that said ditch is owned by Charles Kaess and Volney Eggleston; that said ditch takes its water from said Oak Grove Creek and its head is on the West side of said creek; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 57 acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch,
