

used for the irrigation of one hundred and nine and one half acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of the owner thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 295, constantly, two and seven hundredths (2.07) cubic feet of water per second of time; that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly, under and by virtue of priority No. 318, the further quantity of five hundred and fifty-two thousandths (.552) of one cubic foot of water per second of time; and that into said ditch, there be further allowed to flow, under and by virtue of priority No. 386, constantly, the further quantity of twenty-six hundredths (0.26) of one cubic foot of water per second of time.

No. 326—The Stout Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 300, which is also Stout Creek priority No. 16; that said ditch takes its water from said Stout Creek and its headgate is situate on the South side of said creek in the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 12, Tp. 48 N, R 10 East; that said ditch is owned by Francis M. Allred and Monte A. West, each of whom owns an undivided one half thereof; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of fifty-three (53) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, for the irrigation of twenty-three acres of land owned by said West and thirty acres owned by said Allred, under and by virtue of said priority No. 300, two and twelve-hundredths (2.12) cubic feet of water per second of time.
