

priority No. 17; that said ditch is owned by Martin B. Gardner and R. A. Gardner; that the headgate of said ditch is situate on the South side of main Tallahassee Creek from which headgate the N. W. corner of Section 24, Tp. 17 S, R 73 West bears N. 30 degrees and 56 minutes; distant 1780 feet; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of three (3) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use of the owners thereof, under and by virtue of said priority No. 310, three fourths of one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during four periods, of not more than five days each, as shall be necessary for the irrigation of said three acres of land. Provided, however, that as between the said The Gardner Ditch No. 4 and the ditches of Kate Gorman herein decreed on The Gardner Ditch No. 4 shall have the exclusive right and privilege to use and divert all of the water flowing in the main (or North Fork of) Tallahassee Creek five days in each and every week, commencing at 6 P. M on Tuesday of each and every week to and until 6 P. M on Sunday of each and every week.

No. 332—The Bowerman Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 311, which is also Adobe and Mineral creek priority No. 13; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of six acres of land and is entitled (if it can be done without interference with prior rights) to irrigate twenty-five acres of land; that said ditch takes its water from Adobe Creek and its headgate is situate on the South side of said creek on the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 7, Tp. 21 S, R 69 West in the County of Custer; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of
