

John Bowerman, who is the owner of said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 311, one half of one cubic foot of water per second of time, for five days out of each eight days, or for such less time as shall be sufficient for the irrigation of twenty-five acres of land; provided—(1st) that if the amount of water available for said ditch is less than one half of one cubic foot of water per second of time, then the same shall be allowed to flow into said ditch for a proportionally longer time, and 2nd that if said Bowerman shall not proceed with diligence to clear and cultivate said nineteen acres of land not now in cultivation, then his supply of water shall be liable to be reduced by further order of this Court.

#### No. 332A—The McCormick Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 74 and 311, which are also Texas Creek priorities No's 5 and 86-A; that said ditch is owned by D. B. McCormick; that the headgate of said ditch is situate on the East side of Texas Creek in the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 13, Tp. 47 N, R 12 East; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of nine and one half acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use of the owner thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 74, one cubic foot of water per second of time, for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of Eight acres of land; and that said amount of water be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of the owner thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 311, for such additional time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of one and one half acres of additional land.
