

36 minutes East, about 2355 chains; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of seventy-two (72) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly during the irrigation season, under priority No. 313, for the irrigation of twenty-three and one third acres of land owned by said Woodriff, nineteen and two thirds acres owned by said G. W. Kendrick and M. T. Kendrick, and sixteen acres owned by said Bolt, Dupps and Hamilton, two and thirty-six hundredths (2.36) cubic feet of water per second of time, and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the irrigation of twelve acres of land owned by said Woodriff, under and by virtue of priority No. 399, the further quantity of one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said 12 acres of land.

No. 335—The Thomas Patton Ditch No. 3.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 314, which is also Beaver Creek priority No. 47; that said ditch is owned by Thomas Patton; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of four and three quarter acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said owner, under and by virtue of priority No. 314, one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of four and three quarters ($4\frac{3}{4}$) acres of land; and also that the water hereinbefore decreed to be allowed to flow into the Thomas Patton Ditch No. 2 may be taken through this ditch instead of that one if the parties entitled thereto shall prefer so to do, and with the priorities belonging to said Thomas Patton Ditch No. 2.
