

cubic feet of water per second of time; and that there be further allowed to flow into said ditch, constantly, for the use of said owner, under and by virtue of priority No. 395, the further quantity of one hundred and five thousandths (0.105) of one cubic foot of water per second of time.

#### No. 340—The Reece Ditch Extension.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 321, which is also Hardscrabble Creek priority No. 53; that said ditch is owned by William C. Parker; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of fifteen (15) acres of land; that said ditch takes its water from Hardscrabble Creek through the Reece Ditch; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch from said Hardscrabble Creek through the Reece Ditch, for the use of said Parker, under and by virtue of priority No. 321, one half of one cubic foot of water per second of time, to be measured at the head of this extension (not at the head of the Reece Ditch) for three days in each eight days, or for such less time as shall be sufficient for the irrigation of said fifteen acres of land; the times to be chosen as far as practicable, to alternate with the other ditches having prior rights and having water for less than the whole time.

#### No. 341—The Griffin Ditch No. 4.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities No's 322 and 399, which are also Oak Creek priorities No's 17 and 26; that said ditch is owned by George W. Griffin; that the headgate of said ditch is situate on the East side of said Oak Creek at a point 387 feet N. 65 degrees and 45 minutes West from the S. E. corner of the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 23, Tp.
