

the East side of Texas Creek at a point to find which begin at the common corner of sections 20, 21, 28 and 29, Tp. 21 S, R 73 West, County of Custer, run thence N, 56 degrees East, 10.50 chains, thence N. 58 degrees and 15 minutes East 8.40 chains to headgate; that said ditch is used by said Seaborn Caughman for the irrigation of twenty (20) acres of land; that it seems that Sidney B. McClurken is also using said ditch for the irrigation of twenty (20) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Seaborn Caughman, under and by virtue of priority No. 346, one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said twenty acres of land owned by said Caughman; and that if the same can be done without injury to said Seaborn Caughman, and without interference with the rights of the said Seaborn Caughman in and to his said The Caughman Ditch No. 2, then there shall be further be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 346, for the use and benefit of said Sidney B. McClurken the additional quantity of one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of twenty acres of land.

No. 355—The North Squaw Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 347, which is also Cottonwood Creek priority No. 19; that said ditch is owned by David Endsley; that the headgate of said ditch is situate 69 rods East, and 9 rods South from the N. W. corner of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5, Tp. 17 S, R 73 West; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of four (4) acres of land; that said ditch is 14 inches wide, at the top, 7
