#### No. 369—The Reed Ditch No. 2.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 366, which is also Texas Creek priority No. 100, and Brush Creek priority No. 42; that said ditch is owned by H. G. Reed; that the headgate of said ditch is situate at a point on the South side of said Brush Creek to find which begin at the S. W. corner of the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 14, Tp. 46 N, R. 12 East, in the County of Custer, thence running N. 24 degrees and 45 minutes E, 6.2 chains to head of ditch; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of twenty-five acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of said Reed, under and by virtue of priority No. 366 one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as is sufficient for the irrigation of said 25 acres of land.

#### No. 370—The Sprecher Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 368, which is also Howard Creek priority No. 16; that said ditch is owned by L. J. Morrison; that the headgate of said ditch is situate on the North side of said Howard Creek at a point 66 feet North, 47 degrees East, from the headgate of the Chavers Ditch herein decreed on; that said ditch is used for
