RESOLUTION NO. 2018-03

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING POLICIES REGARDING MERCHANT PEDDLING IN THE PUBLIC R.O.W. DURING THE FOURTH OF JULY HOLIDAY

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Silverton, Colorado has a vested interest in preserving the character and integrity of the Town's public spaces, facilities and rights of way; and


WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Silverton is desirous of affording its residents and others with ties to the community an opportunity to commemorate events, or the area's heritage in a manner that can be shared and enjoyed in the public forum; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Trustees is in collective agreement that the outlined policy will act as an effective instrument in guiding the Board evenly in its consideration of whether licensed merchant wares are suitable for placement in a public area on a temporary basis and whether such addition will either enhance the public's ability to enjoy such areas or detract from it;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SILVERTON THAT:

The Town Board approves a temporary exemption to Municipal Code Section 11-2-80 'Peddling Prohibited in Public Right of Way' for Fourth of July Sidewalk Sales, to allow local licensed merchants to peddle their wares in the public right of way in the business district from the 10th St intersection of Blair and Greene to 14th St intersection of Blair and Greene, including the side streets in between, as outlined in Resolution 2018-03 Exhibit A. This exemption does not include alcohol sales, which are restricted to licensed premises only. Merchants shall extend no more than 32" from the face of the building or beginning edge of the Public R.O.W. and 32" out in the direction of the street. Merchants shall mitigate any tripping hazards. This temporary provision for peddling in the public right of way will be in effect July 3rd, 4th and 5th, 2018 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. These exemptions are hereby adopted in their entirety and shall remain in full force and effect until 8:00 p.m. July 5, 2018.
