Age-Specific Sensory & Communication Supplement – Training

Purpose

The purpose of the Age-Specific Sensory & Communication Supplement of the Assessment tool is to capture focused information about the participant's functioning and communication based on his/her age and allow assessors and parents/guardians to document and discuss potential sensory issues and next steps.

Overview of Contents

This module is divided into six age-specific sections. Assessors will **only** need to complete the section that corresponds with the participant's chronological age. These items replace the majority of Section 3 in the Sensory and Communication module for participants age 0-12.

Each section contains two items:

- The first item includes tasks, scenarios, and other sensory/processing tasks phrased as response options that should be checked if the scenario applies to the participant.
- The second item is used to identify whether any of the checked responses are expected to last for more than one year.

The first item contains targeted responses based on the participant's chronological age. Assessors should check all that apply.

General Instructions for Completing the Module

This module is intended to provide information in addition to the information captured within the Sensory and Communication module. Assessors should work with the participant/parent/guardian to respond to the items and note any areas that may be problematic.

Younger participants may demonstrate certain symptoms but parents and medical professionals may not recognize them as a sensory processing disorder (SPD). Assessors should not attempt to diagnosis an SPD, but should document signs, symptoms, and interventions and, if necessary, provide a referral for further testing.

In completing this module, the assessor should use a variety of information sources, including interviews with the participant or others, observation, and record review (e.g., medical records, professional assessments, etc.).

Section Instructions

Section instructions provide specific discussion and guidance for each section and items in the module. In the tables below, the assessment item is identified in the left column. Guidance specific to the item is then written in the right column.

Section 1: Age 0-6 Months

Section 1 should be used only with participants age 0-6 months old. It contains sensory and communication tasks and scenarios specific to the participant's age.

Section 6 should be used only with participants age 37-47 months old. It contains sensory and communication tasks and scenarios specific to the participant's age.
