This presentation is designed for a wider audience including Health First Colorado members, family members, community resource agencies, and potential providers to understand the new Transition Services landscape.

This summer the Department hosted stakeholder meetings across Colorado to discuss implementation of Transition Services in Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid

Program) Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) waivers and State Plan benefits and the next phase of Colorado Choice Transitions.

This presentation will provide an opportunity for stakeholders who were unable to attend an in-person meeting during the statewide Roadshow.

The stakeholder presentation will answer the following questions:

- What are the new Transition Services?
- Which services can a person access depending on their situation and how can they access services?
- What are the roles and responsibilities of the various Transition Services providers?
- How does an organization become a Transition Services provider?
- What is happening with CCT?

What are Transition Services?

Colorado Choice Transitions (CCT) is Colorado's demonstration of the federal Money Follows the Person (MFP) grant. CCT was initiated in 2013. CCT enrollment ended December 31, 2018. CCT services for individuals transitioned through CCT will continue until MFP funding for services ends December 31, 2020.

However, Colorado has implemented CCT demonstration services into the ongoing Health First Colorado program, now called "Transition Services". Individuals can access

Transition Services if they wish to transition from an institutional setting to the community or are already living in the community and experiencing a life transition.
