Reason for Merger

- Waiver Simplification
 - Long-Term Care Advisory Committee/Community Living Advisory Group
 - Currently Colorado has 12 waivers
- Benefits of merging
 - Globalization of services to assist larger population of clients
 - > Streamlined process
 - > Similar services offered between waivers

How to Transfer

- Contact client as soon as possible to discuss merger and the client's options
 - > Client must be provided a choice
 - Clients will be receiving a letter from the Department explaining PLWA and EBD merger
 - > Transfer must be complete by March 2014

How to Transfer

- Complete new initial 100.2 assessment and Service Plan
 - No face-to-face contact required if Case Manager has seen client in last 6 months
 - > Document in the BUS:
 - Initial 100.2 assessment and new Service Plan
 - Ensure EBD has been selected in the 100.2, Service
 Plan, Program Area Tab and Case Status Tab
 - > New PMIP needed if older than 90 days

How to Transfer

- Ensure new signatures on Service Plan
- Send new 803
- Notify PLWA Providers
 - Contact <u>nicholas.clark@state.co.us</u> to enroll new EBD providers
- Update PARs
 - > Close PLWA PAR and submit new EBD PAR
- Send DSS-1 to county tech to notify them of the program change
